Housing and Homelessness

Pre-announced

- \$300m construct 1,000 social housing dwellings over the next three years
- \$24m fast-track 220 social housing dwellings
- \$2.1m medium/long-term supported accommodation facility (with Hobart City Mission)
- \$16.8m extension of 24/7 Safe Space for rough sleepers in Hobart, Burnie and Launceston; emergency accommodation in hotels/motels/cabins and mental health support services

- \$123.8m new housing projects including the debt waiver program
- \$2m expansion of Private Rental Incentive Scheme



Food Security and Emergency Relief

Key Announcements

- \$1.6m emergency relief providers (Loaves and Fishes, Foodbank, Meals on Wheels, Hamlet, Waterbridge, Food Coop, Scrubby Hill Farm)
- \$1.1m emergency relief payments
- Funding to develop a food security strategy expected in 2021/22 State Budget



Energy

- \$15m public housing heating and energy efficiency initiatives
- \$3.8m progress Project Marinus and other renewable energy projects
- 100% government electric vehicle fleet by 2030 and trial zero emissions
 Metro buses
- \$45m continue energy concessions
- Extension of moratorium on disconnections to 31 March 2020

Climate Change



- \$90m Stage 2 of the RHH redevelopment, including expanded ED and ICU

- \$50m meet additional demand and beds in major hospitals



Mental Health

- \$4m implement recommendations of Child and Adolescent Mental Health Services (CAMHS) review

Community Services Industry

Pre-announced

- Equal Remuneration Order (ERO) \$135m State Government funding across the Forward Estimates
- Indexation for peak bodies, retrospective to 1 July 2019

- TasCOSS \$350,000 to assist our industry adapt and respond to COVID-19
- No Interest Loans Scheme (NILS) \$1m to support more Tasmanians
- Palliative Care Tasmania \$1m to support families in their dealings and the Guardianship & Admin Board
- Additional funding of \$160k (announced last year as \$320k) for Family Planning Tasmania, Hobart Women's Health Centre, The Link, Pregnancy Counselling & Support Tasmania
- Cancer Council Tasmania \$500,000 to support service delivery
- \$4.9m reform agenda for AOD sector
- \$3.8m community healthcare initiatives, supporting Epilepsy Tasmania, Stroke Foundation, Scarlett Alliance and Health Consumers Tasmania

Other Announcements

Pre-announced

- Land tax waived for commercial property owners financially impacted (part of \$1b support package)
- Loans scheme for local governments: interest free over three years (\$200m)
- RSL grants (up to \$25k to help provide a new service or program)
