Unpacking 'vulnerability': Intersectionality & the lived experiences of people on low incomes

Does your organisation engage Tasmanians living on low incomes?

Do you want to build knowledge and compassion to improve community and organisational outcomes?

This professional development workshop, run by the TasCOSS Community Voices Program, supports organisations to develop an inclusive understanding of what 'vulnerability' means for those who experience it and explore the implications of that in organisational settings. The workshop takes an 'intersectional' lens on financial vulnerability, exploring how diverse identities and experiences intersect to result in cumulative forms of marginalisation.

Workshops are delivered with Community Voice Partners who share their stories of living on low incomes. Participants will:

- Unpack vulnerability in organisational settings
- Understand intersectionality in organisational practice
- Engage with lived experiences of financial vulnerability
- ✓ Develop transferable tools
- ✓ Reflect on practice
- ✓ Identify pathways to enhancement
