

TAE40122 Certificate IV in Training & Assessment



NDA Training Tasmania, in conjunction with the Workforce Coordination Project (TasCOSS and partnering sector peak bodies NDS, ECA Tasmania Branch, ACCPA), are offering a fully funded Certificate IV in Training and Assessment – TAE40122. It is funded as part of the Local People in Local Jobs initiative, supported by the Tasmanian Government through the Department of State Growth.

The TAE40122 is a requirement for any individual who is delivering training and assessment services in the vocational education and training (VET) sector.

The training will be delivered in Hobart and Launceston and will involve 3 x 3 days of classroom training, plus 1 x 4 day block of observations, starting in May 2024. It is essential that you are able to commit to attending ALL TRAINING DAYS to be eligible to enrol into the program.

Why NDA?

NDA is a 100% locally owned and operated Registered Training Organisation (RTO) and has been providing training to the Tasmanian community for over 35 years.

Entry Requirements

Those entering this program must be able to demonstrate vocational competency in their proposed teaching and assessing area. Vocational competency is defined as broad industry knowledge and experience, and may include, but is not limited to, holding the relevant units of competency or qualification. NDA requires learners to be able to fulfil the following requirements:

- Have access to a computer (with Adobe Reader, Microsoft Word and internet access)
- Have a reasonable level of language, literacy and numeracy skills
- Have an intermediate level of technology skills
- Be able to attend ALL training days as per the below dates.
- Be able to commit to completing approx. 10-20 hours of post-course work, in between each of the four training clusters.

How is the Qualification Delivered?

The Certificate IV in Training and Assessment is made up of 12 Units (6 Core and 6 Elective) of competency. These units will be delivered during nine days of classroom training, followed by four days of observations. Learners will be required to complete approx. 10-20 hours of work in between each cluster.
